Student Spotlight

Harold M. Bradford
December 19, 1949 to August 13, 2002



Texas Tech has lost an outstanding graduate student. Masters degree graduate student, Harold Bradford, from the Texas Tech History department leaves a legacy of student leadership and academic scholarship at Texas Tech.

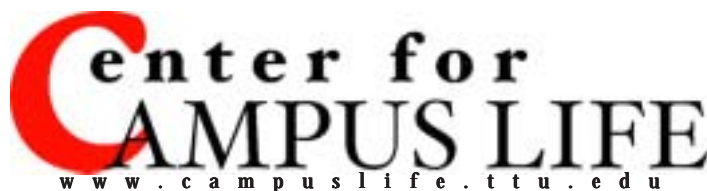
Harold Bradford was recognized as a leader and mentor to many organizations. He was the founding president of the Texas Tech Black Graduate Student Association, served as a Congressman for the History Department in the Graduate and Professional Student Government Association and advised the Omega Psi Beta Sorority, Men of God Christian Fraternity, Inc., and the Alpha Omega Fraternity.

As a graduate assistant and committed historian, Bradford made contributions through the History Department. Curator of the acclaimed exhibit, "African American Involvement in the Development of Texas," containing pictorial historical references of the lives of African American residents in West Texas. Bradford spent hours visiting local community members during development of the research project, enriching the study with the individual anecdotes, as well as, documenting broad historical content.

Known for his genteel qualities and highly spiritual personality, Harold Bradford was a licensed and ordained minister who was a gifted vocalist; he provided leadership at New Directions Community Fellowship Church and Lyon's Chapel Baptist Church. Harold will be sorely missed within the halls of Texas Tech University and the greater Lubbock Community.

What is a Campus & Community Involvement Record?

The Involvement Record is a transcript, similar to your academic transcript that documents co-curricular activities and community involvement completed while attending Texas Tech University. Co-curricular activities are events that students participate in outside of the classroom, such as public speaking, volunteering, and organization leadership, to name a few.

Why do I want Involvement Record?

An Involvement Record helps you to become more marketable for prospective employment, graduation school admissions, or professional school admissions.

Example:

06/01 - 07/03	Alpha Phi Omega	Member
05/02 - Present	Student Government	President

What can I include on my Involvement Record?

1. Organization Activities
2. Recreation/Athletic Activities
3. Department Activities
4. Other Campus Involvement
5. Honors/Awards
6. Participatory Activities
7. Community Activities

How do I get my Involvement Record started?

There is a new and exciting way to start your Involvement Record. The Center for Campus Life has created an online database, which allows you to log-in and enter your activities and accomplishments. For example, if you participated in a fundraising project for MDA, you can log in to the database and enter the specifics about that community service project. As you add activities and involvement, your record will be updated automatically to include all information you have entered. When you are ready, you can print out an unofficial Involvement Record or request an official Involvement Record from the Center of Campus Life.

Student Organization Academy & Registration Kick-Off

The start of re-registration for the 2003-2004 academic year will officially begin at the Student Organization Academy scheduled for Saturday, March 29, 2003 in the Student Union Building. Education sessions and lunch will be provided free of charge.

Keynote speaker for the Academy will be Paul Loeb, nationally recognized as an author and lecturer "with a cause." Paul Loeb has spent thirty years researching and writing about citizen responsibility and empowerment--asking what makes some people choose lives of social commitment, while others abstain.

An Associated Scholar at Seattle's Center for Ethical Leadership, Loeb has also done over 800 TV and radio interviews, including nationwide appearances on TV networks like CNN, PBS, Fox News, C-Span, the NBC Nightly News, National Public Radio, the BBC, ABC, NBC, and CBS radio networks, American Urban Radio, and national German, Australian, and Canadian radio.
